The Numbers

In January 2024 a total of 584 young people had been identified as Electively Home Educated. This compares to a total of 358 in 2020/21, 347 in 2021/22 and 411 in 2022/23.

The Reasons

- Mental health or directly as a response to emotionally based school non-attendance (EBSNA).
- Unhappiness with the alternative provision offer at the point of exclusion.
- Withdrawal due to Covid.
- Withdrawal due to the local education offer.



EHE- Vulnerability
