Derby Cathedral

<u>Derby Cathedral</u> is delighted to announce that it has been awarded a £75,000 grant over five years to be part of the <u>National Schools Singing Programme</u>, founded and supported by the <u>Hamish Ogston Foundation</u>.

The grant will help pay for a newly appointed full time Choral Director for Schools, who will work with schools across Derby and Derbyshire, particularly in areas of social deprivation, to provide a high-quality musical education to children by introducing them to choral singing in their school setting.



Dean of Derby, the Very Revd. Dr Peter Robinson says:

"We are delighted to have been successful with our application to be one of six pilot Anglican Cathedrals as part of the National Schools Singing Programme. This gives us the means to expand our Music in Schools initiative, which is a key part of our strategy and direction for learning and partnerships. We are immensely grateful to the Hamish Ogston Foundation for funding this programme."

The National Schools Singing Programme is based on the model developed in the Catholic <u>Diocese of Leeds</u> where it has seen great success since it began in 2003, now reaching over 6,000 children a week.






Reimagine



Reimagine:

The Reimagine sessions launched on February 11th and will be taking place every Saturday until April at the Artcore Community Hub on Charnwood Street, Derby. This project is for young people between the ages of 10 and 16 years and is designed to develop their understanding around the impacts of global warming, through sustainable making and crafting. Outcomes from the project will involve research, character designs, body adornments made from recycled materials and a performance piece.

Leading the sessions is polymer clay artist and silversmith, Fiona Adamson. To date, the group have investigated different body adornments, headwear, and costumes from around the world including those from theatre, carnivals, festivals and other performance art forms. The workshops aim to encourage young people to become more aware of environmental issues whilst exploring themes surrounding identity and symbolism.

The project will be underpinned by the powerful message of Reduce, Re-use, Recycle and Reimagine. Artcore are creating the opportunity for young people to make themselves into 'Derby City Superheroes' to make sure their voices are heard loud and clear! This project will culminate in a final showcase, representing the power of communities to work together to bring about positive change.

Darley Swifts is a project working with Walter Evans CofE Primary School in response to the declining population of swifts in Britain by focusing on the prevalence of this issue in Darley Park. Research by Derbyshire Wildlife Trust confirms the importance of the swifts in Darley Park.

This project looks at the declining population of swifts in our neighbourhood and we are working with year 5/6 students of Walter Evans to create a mosaic art trail through Darley Park to increase public awareness.

In the first session, Mick Hardwick, a representative for the Derby Wildlife Trust and Derby Swift conservation project, highlighted key facts about the life of swifts. Students were then encouraged to create fact files, demonstrating their understanding, which will later inspire them when creating their mosaics.

In the second session, students visited Darley Park with professional artist Nicki Dennett, who is leading this project. Inspired by work of Andy Goldsworthy students created their own miniature land art with pieces of nature found in the park. Following on from this the students have designed and started to create their mosaic artworks.

What does the new National Plan for Music Education mean for you?

An online briefing about the DfE's latest policy document for Music Education – The power of music to change lives: a national plan for music education – and creating your School Music Development Plan. The new national plan was launched in June 2022 and demonstrates how music should be delivered in **all** schools:

"To enable all children and young people to learn to sing, play an instrument and create music together, and have the opportunity to progress their musical interests, including professionally"

The document sets out the government's vision for music education and how this can be achieved through partnerships with schools, music hubs, the music and creative sector, and others.

Wider Opportunities 2022-23



The Derby & Derbyshire Music Partnership's 30-week programmes, delivered by specially trained teachers, can play a valuable role in your school's music provision. The National Plan for Music Education and the Model Music Curriculum both state that children should learn to play an instrument as part of a whole-class instrumental programme supported by teachers from their local Music Education Hub.

Derby & Derbyshire Music Partnership programmes

We offer programmes of Wider Opportunities in four instrumental categories:

Woodwind –Fife, Flute, Oboe and Clarinet
 Brass – Trumpet, Cornet, Trombone, Baritone and/or Euphonium
 Strings – Violin, Viola, Cello and/or Double Bass; Ukulele
 World Percussion – Djembe (African drums); Samba Band; Steel Pans

Year-long programmes consist of 30x 45-minute lessons spread over three terms, timetabled at a convenient time for you. A class set of instruments will also be provided along with any resources for follow-up activities.

Benefits for schools and pupils

Self-confidence | Pupils are taught within a normal classroom situation where their self-confidence grows as they learn alongside each other and their teachers.

Shared success | Performances are planned into the programme, giving parents the opportunities to share in their children's success.

Continued learning | There is the opportunity to continue instrumental tuition after the programme has ended.




