












Derby Cathedral

A full-size copy of the world-famous Shroud of Turin is coming to Derby Cathedral and will be on display from Saturday 9 March to Sunday 7 April.


The Shroud of Turin exhibition includes a beautiful 15-foot replica image which is a photograph printed onto cotton by an American photographer, Barrie Schwortz, who was the official photographer at the STuRP (Shroud of Turin Research Project) examination of the Shroud in 1978.

The genuine Shroud of Turin which shows the image of a man who has been crucified is preserved with great reverence in the Cathedral of Turin and the full-length replica is very rare.

The exhibition has travelled widely and has been on display at Westminster Cathedral, Dublin Pro-Cathedral and Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral.

There will be a talk by Pam Moon inside the Cathedral on Wednesday 13th March, at 18:30 which is free to attend.



Derby & Derbyshire Music Partnership

The revised National Plan for Music Education states that schools should have a School Music Development Plan (SMDP) in place. The National Plan sets out the government's vision for music education and how this can be achieved through partnerships with schools, music hubs, the music and creative sector, and others: "to enable all children and young people to learn to sing, play an instrument and create music together, and have the opportunity to progress their musical interests, including professionally". The Derby & Derbyshire Music Partnership is required by Arts Council England and the DfE to engage with all schools and to hold annual School Music Education Plan (SMEP) conversations with school. These sessions can be held online and take around 30minutes with the Area Leader, Rebecca Maiden. To book a meeting please use this link

Please visit our <u>Infant, Primary and Junior</u> web-area for details on the wide range of <u>whole class music</u> (WCET) provision available for your school and pupils across all primary key stages. Booking for Wider Opportunities will open in March for all schools for September 2024 programmes. All other programmes can be booked at any time.

The sessions, which are delivered by Hubbub Theatre and Derby's professional orchestra Sinfonia Viva, offer young people a chance to express themselves, have fun, and unleash their creativity. All workshops are free, with free food for everyone taking part. Free transport is also available if needed.

Sessions run every week 4.30 - 6.30 pm during term time starting this Thursday 7^{th} March up until Thursday 11^{th} July. All sessions take place at Hubbub Theatre's home and new SEND inclusive hub at Deda Derby.

Derby Museums Holidays Activity and Food Programme (HAF) will deliver activities that reflect our collections and exhibitions with a focus on creative, and STEAM based activities for young people aged 11-16 years.

Free activities will be available for families in Derby who are eligible for benefits – related free school meals, we will also provide a healthy and nutritious meal from our award-winning River kitchen.

These activities will take place during the Easter and Summer holidays in 2024.

To book a FREE place you will need your child's unique HAF code which your school will issue.

Additional paid spaces will be available for £20 per day.

Easter- Join Derby Museums as we immerse ourselves in historic imagery of Derby, loved by Alfred E. Goodey. Taking inspiration from his collection, we will create our own interpretation of a modern Derby and celebrate spaces and places for young people.

We will then participate in the creation of the What if? machine at the Museum of Making, a celebration of making, creating, designing, and building, where participants will have the opportunity to contribute to the final machine.
